

ACCESSORIES

- Green bucket hat and Akubra style broad brim hat (compulsory for Agriculture and Physical Education, No baseball caps, berets or beanies).

SHOW UNIFORM

- Shirt - green long-sleeved chambray (available on loan).
- Trousers - bone moleskins.
- Tie - school tie (available on loan).

PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM

- Shorts - black dual purpose sport and swim
- Bike pants - black or bottle green (optional).
- Urrbrae shirt - red with green piping and school logo.
- Footwear - appropriate sports shoes.



SUN CARE / HAT POLICY

Taking into account recommendations from the Anti-Cancer Foundation an Urrbrae Agricultural High School Hat Policy has been adopted.

RATIONALE

In accordance with legislation concerning dress code policy in public schools under the Education Act, Urrbrae Agricultural High School Council, with support from the Principal and the school community, has adopted a Uniform Policy. The term uniform covers both the general school uniform and the sports/PE uniform. It is the expectation of the school that all students in all year levels will comply with the uniform policy.

PURPOSE

- To provide a safe school environment.
- To project an identification with the school and a positive school image.
- To develop a high standard of appearance and neatness.
- To remove one form of peer pressure by ensuring equal status amongst students.
- To develop a social and educational environment favourable to learning and acceptable forms of behaviour.

To achieve these purposes, the following apply:

- Wearing of the uniform will enable the recognition of students on school grounds and the identification of strangers.
- Choice of uniform items will take into consideration cost, availability, serviceability, safety factors and identification with the school.
- The uniform will be worn **correctly** at all times at school. It is expected to be clean, tidy and in a state of good repair.

Written applications for exemption on cultural, medical or religious grounds will be considered.

NON COMPLIANCE

Parents and students enrolling at Urrbrae Agricultural High School undertake to support the school by ensuring that all students will wear correct uniform and maintain it, and their appearance in a neat, clean and conventional manner at all times. Students not complying with the uniform policy will be in breach of the uniform policy expectations and the school's student behavior management policy will be followed.



UNIFORM DESCRIPTION

Shirt

- Urrbrae logo polo shirt.
- Urrbrae logo 'Seniors' polo shirt for Year 12 students (optional).
- Urrbrae logo white buttoned long/short sleeve shirt worn with or without a school tie.
- Plain black or white **short-sleeved** undershirts.
- **No** long-sleeved undershirts.

Jumper

- Urrbrae logo polar fleece
- Urrbrae logo woolen jumper
- Urrbrae logo full zip jacket with hood
- Urrbrae rugby top

Jacket

- Urrbrae water-resistant jacket.
- Driza-bone.

Skirt

- Urrbrae green tartan, no shorter than 10cm above the knee.

Dress

- School green check, no shorter than 10cm above the knee.

Trousers

- Plain school grey (to the ankle).
- Bone Moleskins. (No track pants or jeans).



Shorts

- Plain school grey, no shorter than 10cm above the knee.

Panty hose

- Plain black or flesh coloured (no leggings).

Socks

- Plain black or white.

Footwear

- Plain black leather lace-up shoes.
- Plain black or brown (dark tan) elastic sided work boots.
 - No stripes, dots or logos.
 - Black laces ONLY to match the shoe colour.
 - No sandals, ballet flats, scuffs canvas shoes, thongs or dress boots, for WH&S reasons.

Protective Clothing

- Khaki overalls must be worn for agriculture practicals and some technology units.
