### **Urrbrae Class of 2023 SACE Results**

We were delighted with our Year 12 results last year, with excellent achievements recorded across the entire year level. Congratulations to the following four students who achieved an A+ Grade with Merit:

- Congratulations to Ashlee Gunn and Ashley Bates who were our 2023 Urrbrae SACE Dux with an ATAR of 98.75, with a further 11 students achieving an ATAR in the 90s.
- The number of students who achieved A's and B's remained high, with 21.8% in the A Grade Band and 66.4% at a B Grade or higher.
- 98.2% of Year 12 students successfully completed their subjects in the C Band or higher.

- 100% of our students successfully completed their compulsory Stage 2 Activating Identities and Futures in Year 11. Urrbrae has been a pilot school for this revitalised research project subject with excellent results. All students who completed this subject received a C- or better with the majority of students recording grades in the A and B bands. This year the school is in the final stage of the pilot with the subject to fully replace Research Project across the state in 2025.
- Of 83 students who applied to SATAC, 78 received an offer in the first round.
- Of these university offers, over 50% were in STEM/Agricultural/Environmental related fields, linking beautifully with the specialist nature of Urrbrae Agricultural High School (as stipulated by the Waite Trust).
- Excitingly, two students received offers into Veterinary Bioscience.

Congratulations also to those students who did not choose a tertiary pathway and instead have successfully completed their SACE. Many of these students have walked straight into apprenticeships and job opportunities. No matter what pathway you choose for the future, Urrbrae is proud to have been a part of your journey.



# **Senior School News**

would like to welcome back all our Senior School families. I am very optimistic that this year is going to be a good year for our Year 12s with a variety of events planned for the year. This year, in our CAB (Connectedness and Belonging) Program, we have introduced The Resilience Project, which is focussed on helping our (Year 12) students to gain the skills required to develop resilience as they complete Year 12. This will include lessons around Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness as well as Emotional Literacy. Paired with these lessons we will look at study skills sessions, time management, future career pathways with a variety of university, TAFE and other providers attending to assist students in choosing a post school pathway; and other Wellbeing sessions provided by Encounter Youth, SAPOL and other organisations. In the Year 10 and 11 sections of Senior School, students are settling into their studies, with students enrolled in the first semester compulsory SACE subjects of EIF (10) and AIF (11). EIF students should be on the lookout for work experience placements as these need to be sorted by the end of Week 7. On the other hand, AIF students should be busy gathering their natural evidence and feedback around their topics, so that they can successfully complete their AIF Projects.

### **Home Study**

Year 12 students seem to be generally quite settled into the Senior School area here in C Block. Home Study has been granted; however, it is extremely important that both students and parents understand that approval for Home Study is a privilege and students will continue to have Home Study on the proviso that they meet the expectations of Urrbrae Senior Students, which include signing in and out when arriving or leaving school. Failure to sign in or out will result in students receiving a consequence of after school detention, and potentially losing the privilege of Home Study. Signing in and out is more than just a school expectation; it is for the safety of our students as well, in the event of a fire or other emergency situation.

### "Work smarter not harder"

Many students have already completed their first summative assignments while others are continuing to work towards these. Please encourage your child to communicate with their teachers as their teachers, who are their best resource and are only too happy to assist your child to be successful.

### 2023 SACE Results

I would be remiss if I did not mention our 2023 SACE results; our students are to be commended for their fine achievement. In 2023 we had two students achieve the same enviable ATAR of 98.75, with Ashlee Gunn and Ashley Bates both being named School Dux. The students went off to a wide variety of different career pathways with many students receiving university offers in the first round. As these students are about to embark on their university studies, we wish them all the very best for whatever the future has in store. Many other students continued with apprenticeships and others went straight into the work force, with many relaying to us their excitement to be doing something they have always wanted, but many missing school ... who would have thought it!

### Year 12 Formal

Our Year 12 Formal is fast approaching and will be held at the Wine Centre on Friday May 24<sup>th</sup>. We have a wonderful committee of students working hard to ensure that the night is a wonderful celebration of our young people's final year of schooling.

# Year 7 Humanities: Working in the Wetlands

ur newest students to Urrbrae have begun their learning of geographical skills and concepts by visiting the Urrbrae Wetlands.

While at the wetlands, some students have been learning about biophysical environments by collecting, recording, and sorting samples found in the wetland's environment. Other students have been learning mapping skills and the key features of a map, using the acronym B.O.L.T.S.S (border, orientation, legend, title, scale, source) Naomi Ey HASS and Environment Coordinator



and participated in an orienteering session locating important points around the wetlands on a map. Students have also been learning about the geographical concepts (S.P.I.C.E.S.S.) in the context of the wetlands. S.P.I.C.E.S.S., which stands for Space, Place, Interconnection, Change, Environment, Sustainability and Scale, are the 'big ideas' used to help students learn to think like a geographer.




## **Boarding Providers Urgently Needed**





#### PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT SCHOOLS ARE FOR THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILDREN

Local Councils impose a variety of parking restrictions at and near schools to achieve a safer environment for your children. These restrictions are also to optimise traffic movement and safety.




**CONTINUOUS WHITE CENTRE LINE -**If a road has a continuous white centre line, there must

be 3 metres between the vehicle and the white line.

#### **SCHOOL CROSSINGS** -

You cannot stop within 20m of the approach side or 10m of the departure side of a school crossing. SPEED LIMITS -

Speeding vehicles in a school zone are highly dangerous for children. There is a speed limit of 25 kph, designated by the signs and a zigzag line below, any time when children are present or when the lights are flashing (depending on the type of crossing).





You cannot park within 10m of the intersection.

#### **CROSSING PLACES (driveways)**

You may park so that the front of your vehicle is level with the approach or the back is level with the departure side of a driveway to any private or public property so that vehicles can enter and depart safely.

#### FOOTPATHS / NATURE STRIPS -

Parking is prohibited at all times. It creates dangerous situations for both pedestrians and other vehicles in the vicinity.


#### **DOUBLE PARKING** -

Creates dangerous situations anytime, however the danger is increased near schools, especially when children are entering or leaving school.

#### BECAUSE CHILDREN ARE NOT LITTLE ADULTS YOU NEED TO **DRIVE WITH CARE AND CONCENTRATION NEAR SCHOOLS**

#### WHY ARE CHILDREN AT RISK

- Their size means that sometimes they cannot easily see or be seen in traffic.
- Parked vehicles, light poles and other street furniture all block a child's view of the road and also make it difficult for drivers to see them.
- Their concentration is limited and they are easily distracted.
- Their actions are often spontaneous and unthinking (that's why the will dart out on to the road to fetch a ball or weave about when riding their bikes) without checking to see if vehicles or pedestrians are coming.
- Their sight is not fully developed, especially their ability to "scan" for things.
- They are lacking the ability to estimate the speed of vehicles, the gap between vehicles, where a vehicle is coming from or how far way it is.



Make sure your children have reliable supervision at all times when in or near traffic, especially when crossing roads.

#### FOR 5 TO 8 YEARS

Help your children to become familiar with all aspects of the road environment - signs, traffic lights and crossing places.

Teach them cycling skills in a safe area - in a park or playaround etc.

If they are riding a bike to school, plan a safe route for them to take

#### FOR 9 TO 12 YEARS

Take the time to explain the road rules in simple terms e.g.: Right of way, what to do at intersections etc

Go for bike rides with your children to make sure they have safe cycling behaviour
